IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Please read these safety notes carefully **BEFORE** using your Tower appliance.

These warnings have been provided in the interest of safety. Basic safety precautions should always be followed including the following:

GENERAL SAFETY

- Close supervision is necessary when any appliance is used by or near children.
- Children should not play with the appliance.
- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved.
- Cleaning and user maintenance should not be undertaken by children without supervision.
- Take care when any appliance is used near pets.

- The use of accessory attachments is not recommended by the appliance manufacturer, apart from those supplied with this product.
- Do not place the appliance on or near a hot stove top or heated oven.
- This appliance is for household use only.
- Do not place anything on top of the appliance.
- Do not use this appliance for anything other than its intended use.

WHILST USING THE UNIT

- DO NOT touch the evaporator whilst the unit is in use, as it may cause frostbite.
- Do not use with water that is microbiologically unsafe or of unknown quality. Only use potable water.
- Do not clean your ice maker with any flammable fluids. The fumes may create a fire hazard or explosion.
- Do not overturn the ice maker. If the ice maker is overturned accidentally, stand it on a flat and even surface for about 2 hours before attempting to use it again.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

- If the ice maker is brought in from low temperatures, do not use it for a few hours, to allow the unit to warm up to the room temperature.
- NEVER put flammable, explosive and corrosive articles into the ice maker.
- NEVER use the ice maker when there is a flammable gas leakage.
- To prevent fires, NEVER store or use gases and other flammable articles near the ice maker.
- Unplug the ice maker before moving it, to avoid damaging the refrigerating system.
- WARNING: Keep all ventilation openings clear of any obstructions.
- WARNING: Do not use mechanical devices or other means to accelerate the defrosting process, other than those recommended by the manufacturer.
- WARNING: Do not damage the refrigerant circuit.

- WARNING: Do not use electrical appliances inside the food storage compartments of the appliance, unless they are of the type recommended by the manufacturer.
- DO NOT store explosive substances such as aerosol cans with a flammable propellant in this appliance.
- Only carry the unit by the included carry handle.
- In the unlikely event the appliance develops a fault, stop using it immediately and seek advice from the Customer Support Team.

PLUG AND CORD

- Check that the voltage of the main circuit corresponds with the rating of the appliance before operating.
- WARNING: Do not let the cord hang over the edge of a table or counter, serious injury may result from the appliance being pulled off the counter where it may be grabbed by children or become entangled with the user.


IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

- Do not let the supply cord touch hot surfaces.
- Do not carry the appliance by the power cord.
- Do not use any extension cord with this appliance.
- The appliance is not intended to be operated by means of an external timer or separate remotecontrol system.
- Do not pull the plug out by the cord as this may damage the plug and/or the cable.
- Do not plug and unplug with wet hands.

It is important that this instruction manual is retained for future reference.

If the appliance is given to someone else, it should always be accompanied by these operating instructions, as they form an integral part of the appliance.

WIRING SAFETY FOR UK USE ONLY



IMPORTANT: As the colours in the mains lead of this appliance may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, please proceed as follows:

The wires in the mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

Blue neutral [N] Brown live [L]

PLUG FITTING DETAILS (WHERE APPLICABLE).

- The wire coloured blue is the neutral and must be connected to the terminal marked [N] or coloured black.
- The wire coloured brown is the live wire and must be connected to the terminal marked [L] or coloured red.
- On no account must either the brown or the blue wire be connected to the [EARTH] terminal \(\begin{array}{l}\equiv \\ \equiv \\ \equi

- Always ensure that the cord grip is fastened correctly.
- The plug must be fitted with a fuse of the same rating already fitted and conforming to BS 1362 and be ASTA approved.
- If in doubt consult a qualified electrician who will be pleased to do this for you.

NON-REWIREABLE MAINS PLUG.

If your appliance is supplied with a nonrewireable plug fitted to the mains lead and should the fuse need replacing, you must use an ASTA approved one (conforming to BS 1362 of the same rating).

If in doubt, consult a qualified electrician who will be pleased to do this for you.

If you need to remove the plug – disconnect it from the mains – and then cut it off of the mains lead and immediately dispose of it in a safe manner. Never attempt to reuse the plug or insert it into a socket outlet as there is a danger of an electric shock.





BEFORE FIRST USE

PREPARING FOR USE

NOTE: Read all instructions and safety information carefully before first use. Please retain this information for future reference.

- 1. Remove your appliance from the packaging.
- Check that there is no damage to the cord or any visible damage to the body or accessories.
- 3. Dispose of the packaging in a responsible manner.

INSTALLING THE CARRY HANDLE

To use the unit, start by installing the carry handle. To do this, attach the handle to the corresponding brackets on either side of the unit until it is firmly secured. Ensure the handle is firmly secured before attempting to move, lift or carry the unit.

4. Plug the unit in. The indicator will light up and begin to flash to show the unit has been turned on.

NOTE: If the ice maker has been recently moved, allow thirty minutes between plugging it in and attempting to use it.

USING YOUR ICE MAKER

FILLING THE WATER TANK

To begin making ice, start by filling the water tank. To do this, carry out the following steps:

- 1. Open the ice maker lid
- Lift the ice tray, using the two handles to either side of it, and remove it from the unit.
- Fill up the space underneath the tray with water up to the MAX fill line, being careful not to overfill to ensure optimal functionality.
- Once the water tank has been filled, return the ice tray to its position over the water tank. The two handles will automatically slot into place and secure the ice tray in position.
- 5. The unit is now ready for normal use.

NOTE: If at any point during a working cycle the unit runs out of water in the water tank, it will automatically stop working, and the indicator will light up on the unit's control panel. When this occurs, add more water to the water tank, being careful not to fill it past the MAX fill line.

USING YOUR ICE MAKER

TURNING THE UNIT ON/OFF

- Once the unit has been plugged in and the water tank has been filled, as described above, press the word button on the unit's control panel to turn it on. The indicator will light up solid and the unit will automatically start to operate.
- Press this button again while the unit is in operation to pause or cancel the current working cycle. The unit will automatically stop working.

NOTE: A full working cycle takes about ten minutes and will produce eight ice bullets, which will be collected in the basket. A larger quantity of ice can be achieved by taking ice only as and when needed, and leaving unused bullets in the basket to be added into the next batch of ice produced.

SIZE SELECTION

 This unit offers a choice between larger or smaller ice bullets, selectable at the press of a button. Press the select button to choose between larger and smaller sized bullets. The

- corresponding indicator will light up on the control panel to show each size has been selected: for the smaller size, or for the larger size.
- Press this button again while the unit is in operation to change sizes midway through a working cycle. The unit will automatically adapt to the new settings after a few seconds.

NOTE: When the ice tray is full, the indicator will light up on the unit's control panel. When this occurs, use the included ice scooper to remove the ice from the tray and make room for more ice.

THE SELF-CLEANING FUNCTION

This unit is equipped with a self-cleaning function.

Press the self-cleaning function, then press the overful button until the to select the self-cleaning function, then press the overful button to automatically start a self-cleaning cycle.

NOTE: Ensure there is sufficient water in the water tank before attempting to carry out a self-cleaning cycle.

TROUBLESHOOTING

CLEANING AND CARE

WARNING: Before cleaning and maintenance, switch the appliance off and remove the plug from the socket, to prevent electric shock.

- Do not immerse any part of the appliance, power cord or plug in liquids.
- Use a soft damp cloth to wipe the surface. Avoid using detergent, spray or chemicals as these may cause damage to the appliance.

WARNING: DO NOT allow water or steam to enter any part of the appliance other than the water tank, as this could cause it to malfunction.

 Store the appliance in a cool, dry place, ideally in its original packaging.

EMPTYING THE WATER TANK

 To empty the water tank, open up the unit's lid, remove the ice basket from

inside it, then carefully tilt or drain the contents onto a sink or a suitable container. Ensure the water tank is fully drained before storing the unit.

 After emptying, wipe the water tank dry with a soft cloth. Ensure the water tank is fully dry before putting it back into place. or stored, can grow in the water reservoir and be blown in the air causing very serious health risks when the water is not renewed and the tank is not cleaned properly every 3 days.

 Empty the tank and refill it every third day or whenever it becomes empty. Before refilling, clean it with fresh tap water or cleaning agents if required by the manufacturer.

DESCALING INSTRUCTIONS/ WARNINGS.

 Empty and clean the appliance before storage. Clean the appliance before next use.

WARNING: Micro-organisms that may be present in the water or in the environment where the appliance is used

STORAGE

- Ensure that the appliance is cool, clean and dry before you store it.
- Store the appliance in a cool and dry place.

DISPOSAL OF THE UNIT

Appliances bearing the symbol shown here may not be disposed of in domestic rubbish. You are required to dispose of old electrical and electronic appliances like this separately.
